A new hunt ...

Beginning July 1, 2019 **MULE DEER** and white-tailed deer may be harvested in Units 1, 5, 11-13, 20 and 25.

- No closed season and no bag limit.
- Hunters who harvest a mule or white-tailed deer are required to salvage the entire carcass.

Help us learn more ...

ADF&G requests hunters submit samples from harvested mule and white-tailed deer to a local ADF&G office for testing so the department can learn more about the species.

- Head with brain, skull plate intact.
- Heart with lungs attached
- One hoof
- Hide
- Pellets (1/4 cup)

Know your deer!

Mule, white-tailed and Sitka black-tailed deer have different seasons and bag limits! **Don't harvest the wrong animal.**

MULE DEER have a prominent white rump patch, and a narrow, white tail with a black tip. They are larger overall, with ears that are 3/4 the size of their head.

SITKA BLACK-TAILED DEER have an all black tail, are smaller than mule deer and are commonly found in Southeast Alaska, Prince William Sound and Kodiak Island.

WHITE-TAILED DEER have a white, flag-like tail they raise when alarmed.

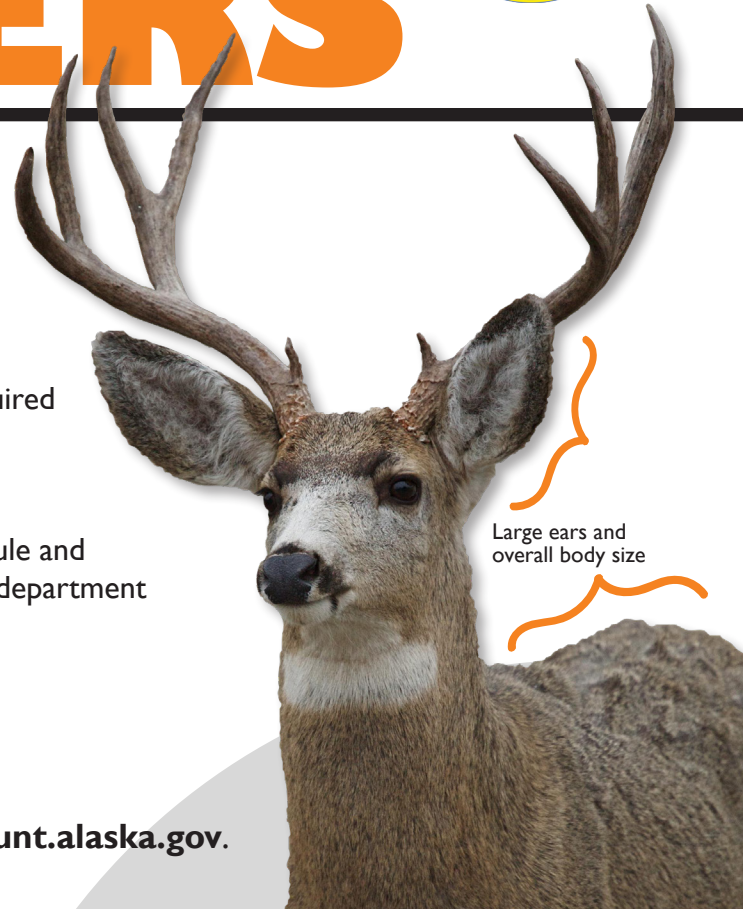

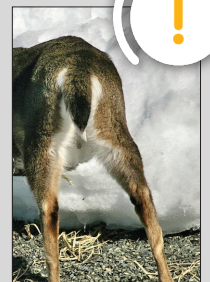
